### Meet Minutes

For the first time since the 2014 season, and the second time under sixth-year coach Jason Butts, the West Virginia University gymnastics team will be represented at the NCAA National Championships, as junior Zaakira Muhammad individually qualified to compete in the all-around.

- Muhammad will compete in the second semifinal session on Friday, April 14, at 8 p.m. EST, inside Chaifetz Arena in St. Louis, Missouri.
- Muhammad earned the highest all-around qualification score for the 2017 NCAA National Championships, finishing in fourth place at the 2017 NCAA Morgantown Regional Championships on April 1 with a 39.325 mark.
- The first WVU gymnast to qualify for the National Championships since Hope Sloanhoffer (all-around) did so in 2014, Muhammad is the 19th individual qualifier and the 16th Mountaineer gymnast to compete in the all-around.
- Muhammad will rotate with No. 6-ranked Alabama Friday night and will compete after six Crimson Tide gymnasts on each event. The group opens the meet on floor exercise. The complete rotation order is: FX-V-BYE-UB-BB-BYE.

### A Look at the Field

- Twelve teams and 12 all-around competitors (who are not on a qualifying team) will compete in two semifinal sessions Friday.
- The top two teams and the top two all-around competitors from each of the six regionals advanced to the NCAA National Championships. In addition, the event winners at each regional also advanced to the National Championships (in their specific event) if they were not part of a qualifying team or the all-around qualifiers.
- Semifinal Session I Teams: No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 4 Utah, No. 5 UCLA, No. 8 Oregon State, No. 9 Denver and No. 13 Washington.
- Semifinal Session II Teams: No. 2 LSU, No. 3 Florida, No. 6 Alabama, No. 7 Michigan, No. 10 Georgia and No. 14 Nebraska.
- Fourteen gymnasts competing in the second semifinal session are ranked in the top 50 nationally in the all-around in the Road to Nationals final regular-season rankings, including No. 4-ranked Kiana Winston (Alabama, 39.56 RQS), No. 7 Alicia Boren (Florida, 39.53 RQS), No. 8 Myia Hambrick (LSU, 39.515 RQS), No. 11 Amelia Hundley (Florida, 39.49 RQS), No. 12 Mollie Korth (Kentucky, 39.47 RQS), No. 13 Nicole Artz (Michigan, 39.41 RQS) and No. 13 Rachel Dickson (Georgia, 39.41 RQS).
- Muhammad had not competed in the all-around in enough meets this year to earn an RQS. She shows a 39.2 season average, which unofficially ranks No. 24 nationally.

### Changes at the NCAA National Championships Since 2014

- Six judges will be assigned to each event in both semifinal sessions. The high and low scores will be dropped, and a gymnast's final score will be an average of the four remaining marks.
- Event finals have been eliminated. Individual event winners, as well as the all-around champion, will be determined following the conclusion of the second semifinal session on April 14.

### What's at Stake?

- All-around and event NCAA champions will be determined following the conclusion of the second semifinal session Friday night by combining the results from both semifinals. The top eight gymnasts in each event, as well as the all-around, will be honored.
- First Team All-America honors will be awarded to the top four finishers, plus ties, from each of the two semifinal sessions for all four events, plus the all-around. Second Team All-America honors will be awarded to the fifth through eighth place finishers, plus ties, from each of the two semifinal sessions for all four events, plus the all-around.

### The Last Time Out

- Muhammad scored 39.325 and finished in fourth place at the 2017 NCAA Morgantown Regional Championships on April 1, at the WVU Coliseum.
- Muhammad tied for third place on floor exercise with a season-high matching 9.9 score. She also placed ninth on vault (9.825), 11th on the uneven bars (9.85) and 18th on balance beam (9.75).
- Seeded fifth, the Mountaineers finished in third place with a program regional-record score of 196.325, a season-high team score. WVU just missed qualifying as a team for the NCAA National Championships, as top-seeded Alabama placed second with a 196.625 mark, just 0.3 points better than the Mountaineers.
- WVU's finish was its best placement since also finishing in third place at the 2007 NCAA Southeast Regional in Morgantown with a 194.775 score.
- In addition to the team total, the Mountaineers also set the program regional uneven bars record (49.35) and matched the floor regional record (49.225).
