No. 10/9 West Virginia Mountaineers (13-2, 2-1)

No. 10 West Virginia Welcomes No. 1 Baylor to the Coliseum

- WVU is 4-8 all-time against AP-No. 1 teams. WVU's last win over an AP-No. 1 team was against Kansas on Jan. 12, 2016, 74-63 in Morgantown. Baylor is the seventh AP-No. 1 to visit Morgantown and second in as many years.
- This will be the fifth time WVU has hosted a game when both teams are ranked in the AP Top 10. The last was No. 3 Oklahoma and No. 10 West Virginia last season. WVU is 6-13 in games when both teams are ranked in the top 10.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 26-13 in the Big 12 in the last two-plus seasons.
- West Virginia is 112-30 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 56-26 mark in league games.
- WVU is 521-150 (.780) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 153-36 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins at the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 80.7 ppg while holding its opponents to 61.6 ppg.
- The Mountaineers have won 70 of their last 99 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in 10th place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 804-323 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Eddie Sutton by two wins for ninth place all-time.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 148-33 in its last 181 games against unranked teams, including 78 of its last 87 at the Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 95-70 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 51-40 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 41-34 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia was its first over a Top 10 team in a true non-conference road game since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU leads the country in scoring margin (28.7), turnover margin (13.7), turnovers forced (24.3) and steals (12.8). WVU ranks third in offensive rebounds (16.0), third in assists (18.9), fourth in scoring offense (90.1), and 15th in scoring defense (61.4).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 Conference in steals, while Nathan Adrian ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but two Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals seven times in 2016-17.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 32.0 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.80 points per possession, tops in the country.
- WVU has forced more turnovers (365) than its opponents have made field goals (312).
- WVU has taken 226 more shots than its opponents this season -- 999 to 773.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 32 of the last 42 games. This year's team is averaging 40.0 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 70 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 27 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history. Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked for 60 weeks during his career.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 26 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 43 of the last 46 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 46 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 52 of their last 53 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 573 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 55 times under Bob Huggins (326 games).
- WVU is 173-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 62 of its last 64 and 118 of its last 129 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 59-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 167-28 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 175-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 148-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 158-28 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 157-37 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 18-12 all-time on Jan. 10 and 499-320 all-time in the month of January.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 804 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 10th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Baylor

- Baylor is 15-0 and 3-0 in the Big 12 following a 61-57 win over Oklahoma State on Saturday.
- The Bears are 1-0 on the road and 3-0 on neutral courts this season. The Bears' Big 12 road win was a 76-50 victory at Oklahoma on Dec. 30.
- Scott Drew, a 1993 graduate of Butler, is 265-172 in his 14th season at Baylor. He is 285-183 in his 15th season overall.

Series Record Against Baylor

- Baylor holds a 7-3 series advantage over West Virginia.
- The Mountaineers have won the last two in the series -- 69-58 in Waco and 80-69 in Morgantown last season.
- West Virginia's third victory in the series was a 66-64 victory at Baylor on Jan. 28, 2014.
- The first meeting took place in the finals of the 2011 Las Vegas Classic. WVU fell in overtime, 83-81, on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Baylor is 3-1 against West Virginia in the WVU Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins is 4-7 all-time against Baylor. Huggins' K-State team defeated Baylor, 69-60, on Jan. 17, 2007, in Manhattan, Kansas. He is 3-7 against Baylor at WVU.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,715-1,061 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.

Recap

No. 10 WVU got its usual 14 points off the bench from senior Jaysean Paige and 11 more from super-sub Tarik Phillip to defeat No. 19 Baylor, 69-58, in Waco, Texas.

It was West Virginia's 13th victory in conference play in 2015-16 - the most by a Mountaineer team since its Final Four season in 2010 when they won 13 games as members of the Big East Conference.

WVU overcame a sluggish start to build a 16-point lead midway through the second half, using an 11-2 run after intermission to take control of the game.

Baylor (21-10, 10-8) finally made its first 3 with 11:38 remaining when Ishmail Wainwright got one to go down, and four more followed during a five-minute flurry that saw the Bears whittle West Virginia's lead down to five with six minutes to go after a pair of Al Freeman free throws.

Then, Daxter Miles Jr., who finished with 10, was able to slip free underneath West Virginia's basket on an inbounds play and Jevon Carter got him the basketball to make it a seven-point game.

"The play Dax made on the out-of-bounds play was huge," said Huggins. "There was seven seconds left on the shot clock when he scores that one."

The next time down the floor, it was Carter's turn to score, answering Freeman's jumper, and then Miles Jr. made another big layup with 4:12 remaining to keep West Virginia's lead at eight.

"It seemed like every time they made a run we either made a steal or came up with a loose ball," said Huggins.

Freshman Esa Ahmad got a short jumper to go down to put the Mountaineers ahead by double digits again, 61-51, and from there it became a free throw game. WVU made 79.3 percent of them.

Taurean Prince led Baylor with 19 points, but needed 17 shot attempts to get those 19.

Jevon Carter also played an outstanding all-around game, scoring eight points, handing out eight assists and making three steals with zero turnovers.

West Virginia shot 45.7 percent from the floor and forced 16 Baylor turnovers. The Bears' 58 points were the fewest scored at the Ferrell Center in 2015-16.

Recap

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 20 points and Jaysean Paige contributed 17 off the bench to give 14th-ranked West Virginia an 80-69 victory over 15th-ranked Baylor at the WVU Coliseum.

"It's good to have 19 wins at this stage in the season and it's even better to be 8-2 in the best conference in America," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

The Bears shot 38 percent for the game - nine percentage points below their season average - and their two best players, Taurean Prince and Rico Gathers, made a combined six of 26 from the floor.

Meanwhile, Devin Williams scored 16 points mostly around the basket, and Nathan Adrian contributed 11 points and a team-high nine rebounds while making his fourth consecutive start in place of suspended forward Jonathan Holton.

A key stretch occurred after Prince's layup with 6:03 left in the first half tied the game at 23. Following two Williams free throws, the Mountaineers got threes from Paige, Miles Jr. and Tarik Phillip during a three-minute stretch to build their lead to eight, 36-28. Free throws by Adrian with 30 seconds remaining gave West Virginia a 38-29 lead at the break.

In the second half, the lead got to 11, 12, 14, 15 and eventually to as many as 19 when Williams banged in a jumper with 9:29 left.

The Bears used a 15-4 run over the next four minutes to get West Virginia's lead down to eight, 68-60, with 3:03 left, and it was a seven-point game at 1:05 when Wainwright got his second three to go down from the top of the key. But free throws from Miles Jr, Phillip and Paige were able to dose out the game.

West Virginia shot 49.1 percent from the floor and turned the ball over just eight times - seven below its season average. Baylor also had a seven-rebound advantage, 41-34, but the Bears got a number of those late when West Virginia was protecting its lead and didn't want to foul.

"We played well," said Huggins. "I thought our interior passing was very good. We spent a lot more time than normal on zone offense. Getting people open is not the problem, but getting to the ball to them is because of their length. They do a great job of playing passing lanes and I thought our interior passing was good."

"Until the end of the game I thought we ran really good offense and I thought we shared the ball," said Huggins.

A crowd of 14,069 watched West Virginia produce its second straight win over a top 15-ranked team.

Academic Success

- Thirty-four of the last 35 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.

Press Virginia

Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on four-of-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or more.

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six steals.

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

Notebook

- The Mountaineers now own a 93-15 all-time record in season openers, including a 99-9 record in home openers.
- The crowd of 10,510 was the fifth time in Coliseum history that WVU had a crowd of 10,000 or more in the month of November.

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14. WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tank Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Dexter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Notebook

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008.
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesville for the first time since 1975.

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers.

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Dexter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Konate) gets

Recap

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67. Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino. Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball. Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players. Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches, rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony. As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor. The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame. With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction. Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakout dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic double play. Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points. The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers. UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

Recap

Esa Ahmad scored 17 points in 24 minutes of action to power 11th-ranked West Virginia to an 84-57 victory over Radford at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia (10-1) used a 23-0 run to build a 32 point first-half lead, the Highlanders nearly having more turnovers than points scored (22 points to 21 turnovers) at the break. WVU shot 58.8 percent from the floor, including 60 percent from 3 in the first half, but those numbers fell off considerably in the second half as Huggins continued to use different players. "The guys that we started, I thought they went out and were walking around so I took them out and put some other guys in and they weren't a whole lot better," said Huggins. "The game has a way of getting even with you when you approach it the wrong way. We went on that big run and we thought the game was over and kind of quit playing." Radford (4-7) actually outscored West Virginia in the second half, 35-31; grabbed two more rebounds than the much taller Mountaineers, led by Sterling Christy's game-high 10 boards, and overall the Highlanders had a 40-37 edge on the glass for the game. "I don't know if it was effort or a lack of focus," said Huggins. "We boxed out and stood and then went and got it. We made an effort to block out sometimes." West Virginia's big advantages were in points in the paint (46-8) and points off of turnovers (41-10). Bench scoring, which has been a staple all season for the Mountaineers, was just plus-eight (33-25). Jevon Carter contributed 15 and Tarik Phillip led the reserves with 13. Overall, West

Recap

Eleventh-ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams.

With the exception Lucas N'Guessan's dunk to begin the game, Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Dexter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil Forte.

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor.

Forde led Oklahoma State with 18.

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation. Macon was a late scratch after suffering a knee injury in the win against Northern Kentucky.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players - Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West - added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better than usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe.

Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7. Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7.

The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61, West Virginia.

Some late 3s from Forte kept the margin under 20.

- The Mountaineers have now won five straight against the Cowboys dating back to the 2014-15 season.
- WVU has won its last four Big 12 openers, all on the road.

Anthony Livingston's 3-point field goal with six seconds left lifted Texas Tech to a 77-76 overtime victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

West Virginia (12-2, 1-1) had trouble stopping Tech's dribble penetration and was also victimized by fouls, the Mountaineers sending the Red Raiders to the free throw line 30 times where they made 20.

Meanwhile, WVU didn't help itself when it got to the foul line, West Virginia converting just 13 out of 24 for 54.2 percent.

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense turned Tech over just 13 times - one fewer than the Mountaineers' 14 for the game.

The Red Raiders shot 51 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 3-point distance.

There were 21 lead changes with the game's biggest lead being seven points - that by West Virginia with 17:13 to go when Dexter Miles Jr. converted a driving layup off a feed from Nathan Adrian. But Texas Tech erased that within a span of five minutes when the Mountaineers went ice cold from the floor.

Texas Tech's scoreless spell came near the end of regulation after Justin Gray's layup with 2:20 left put the Red Raiders ahead by five.

Lamont West's two free throws reduced Tech's lead to three, and then Adrian banged in a 3 with seven seconds left to tie the game at 67.

Shadell Millinghaus tried to win it for Tech in regulation but his 3 was off the mark just ahead of the horn.

In overtime, missed free throws by Tarik Phillip, Miles Jr., Esa Ahmad and Adrian - six in all - kept Tech in position to get the upset.

Two Jevon Carter free throws pushed West Virginia's lead to three, 70-67, but two at the other end by Aaron Ross and then a turnaround jumper by Smith gave the lead back to Texas Tech, 71-70.

Ahmad followed with his two misses at the line before Phillip was able to get two to go down with 2:15 left, putting WVU back ahead, 72-71.

Stevenson answered with a 3 - his second - to make it 74-72. Then, Adrian could only get one of two to go down from the line before Phillip followed a Devon Thomas miss with a 3 to put West Virginia ahead, 76-74, with 33 seconds remaining.

The Red Raiders came down and worked to get into position for a late shot, with Livingston taking it off a feed from Stevenson.

Carter had a chance to win the game for West Virginia at the other end but he couldn't get his 3 to go down with one second left.

Notebook

- It is the first regular season win for the Red Raiders over the Mountaineers since they joined the Big 12 in 2012. Tech's only victory against West Virginia since then came in the first round of the 2013 Big 12 tournament when WVU finished 13-19.

Dexter Miles Jr. scored 22 points and Jevon Carter banged in three critical 3s during a key stretch late in the second half to lead seventh-ranked West Virginia to an 82-70 victory over TCU inside the WVU Coliseum.

In a battle of two 12-2 teams both looking to go 2-1 in Big 12 play, the game boiled down to the final 9:47 when West Virginia outscored the Horned Frogs 25-13.

TCU, which trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, and then again by 11 with 13:12 remaining, used a 15-4 run to tie the game at 57 following a Desmond Bane layup with 9:47 to go.

But Miles answered with a layup and Sagaba Konate followed with a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Vlad Brodziansky while scoring near the basket. Konate's free throw pushed West Virginia's advantage to 62-57.

Then three minutes later, Carter took control of the game with the Mountaineers leading by just four.

Following a missed jumper by TCU's Alex Robinson, Carter came down on the other end and drilled a 3 from the top of the key. The next time down the floor, following a basket by Bane, Carter drained another. This one put WVU ahead by eight, 71-63.

His third came with 2:52 left to put the Mountaineers ahead by nine, 74-65. Konate followed with another lay in and then a steal by Nathan Adrian led to Miles' 3 from the corner to make it a 15-point game with two minutes to go.

West Virginia (13-2, 2-1) used an 18-9 run over the remaining six minutes by holding the Horned Frogs to just three field goals during that stretch of time.

Overall, TCU committed 18 miscues leading to 28 West Virginia points - a deciding factor in the game.

Esa Ahmad added 16 points on seven-of-11 shooting, while Carter and Konate contributed 13 points each. For Konate, who also grabbed eight rebounds coming off the bench, it was a season high in scoring for him.

Adrian, despite scoring just four points, was also a big contributor in the victory by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds, handing out five assists and making two steals. He played a team-high 34 minutes.

Robinson led TCU with 17 points on three-of-nine shooting. Brodziansky added 14 on five-of-six shooting.

Overall, the Horned Frogs made 46.2 percent from the floor and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line - attempting seven more free throws and making eight more than the Mountaineers (nine-of-14).

An announced crowd of 12,568 watched the game.
