QUICK HITTERS

- West Virginia (18-8, 6-8) and Iowa State (14-11, 5-9) cap the regular-season series on Saturday in Ames. The Cyclones shot 51.8 percent from the field and limited the Mountaineers to 29.6 percent shooting in an 80-55 win in Morgantown on Feb. 4.
- WVU owns a 7-3 edge in the all-time series against ISU and holds a 3-1 mark at the Hilton Coliseum. Iowa State has never swept West Virginia in a regular-season series.
- The Mountaineers are riding a two-game win streak after picking up a 66-59 win over 24th-ranked Kansas State on Wednesday. Junior Chania Ray recorded her first career double-double with 14 points and 10 assists. Lanay Montgomery picked up her ninth double-double of the year with 12 points and 12 rebounds. In the past eight seasons,
- West Virginia has knocked off at least two top 25 opponents each year.
- Tynice Martin paces the Mountaineers with 17.6 points per game, followed by Teana Muldrow's 14.3 points per contest. Montgomery leads the Big 12 with a 68.4 FG percentage.

SCOUTING IOWA STATE

- Iowa State (14-11, 5-9) has won three of its last five games, including a 79-68 win over Texas Tech on Wednesday. The Cyclones won the previous matchup with WVU, 80-55, on Feb. 4, in Morgantown.
- The Cyclones lead the nation with an 80.9 free throw percentage (372-of-460) and are 13th nationally with fewest turnovers per game (12.4). ISU is averaging 74.7 points and surrendering 69.3 ppg this season.
- Bridget Carleton leads the Cyclones with 15.9 points and a team-leading 52 three-pointers. The sophomore leads the nation with a 93.3 free throw percentage (84-of-90).
- Seanna Johnson is second on the squad with 15.3 points per game and a team-best 8.2 rebounds per contest.
- Jadda Buckley rounds out Iowa State's double-figure scorers with 13.9 points per game and paces the team with 123 assists.

LAST TIME OUT

- WVU (18-8, 6-8) knocked off its second top 25 opponent of the season with a 66-59 win over No. 24 K-State on Wednesday.
- The Mountaineers led by as many as 19 points in the second quarter, before K-State trimmed the lead to two in the fourth quarter. WVU used a 9-0 run in the final minutes to claim the victory.
- Chania Ray recorded her first career double-double with 14 points and 10 assists, while Lanay Montgomery registered her ninth this season with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Katrina Pardee knocked down four triples and finished with 14 points, while Teana Muldrow rounded out WVU's double-figure scorers with 10 points.
- WVU has knocked off at least two top 25 opponents in eight consecutive seasons.

FEBRUARY FACTS

- West Virginia is 68-49 (.581) in the month of February under Mike Carey.
- Under Carey, when West Virginia wins five or more games in the month of February, the Mountaineers have reached the NCAA Tournament (seven times). Only twice has WVU reached the tournament winning five or fewer games (3 in 2011 and 4 in 2004).
- WVU has won five or more games in February in four of the last five seasons: 6 in 2016, 7 in 2014, 5 in 2013 and 6 in 2012.

MULDROW 16 POINTS FROM 1,000

- Junior Teana Muldrow needs 16 points to become the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point club.
- Muldrow is eighth in the Big 12 with 8.2 rebounds per game and is ninth with 14.3 points per game.
- Muldrow is 12th all-time at WVU with 111 made treys.
- She is 13th all-time with 77 career blocks.
- Muldrow is the active team leader with 49 games scored in double-figures.
- She earned All-Tournament honors earlier this season at the Savannah Invitational.

NEARING SEASON'S END

- As of Friday, WVU holds a team RPI of 48 with five top 100 RPI victories.
- WVU holds top 50 RPI victories over No. 15 Oklahoma, No. 22 Kansas State and No. 38 Auburn.
- If the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship was played today, West Virginia would be the No. 5-seed and face No. 4-seed K-State.

BIG 12 ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

- Five Mountaineers were given Academic All-Big 12 honors on Thursday.
- Lanay Montgomery and Katrina Pardee grabbed Academic All-Big 12 First Team accolades, while Alexis Brewer, Chania Ray and Desiree Rhodes picked up Academic All-Big 12 Second Team recognition.

MONTGOMERY MAGIC

- Senior center Lanay Montgomery leads the Big 12 with a 68.4 field goal percentage (128-of-187) through 26 games.
- Montgomery has shot 41 percent or better in 22 of 26 games this season.
- WVU is 11-1 this season when Montgomery makes six or more field goals in a contest.
- Montgomery's 59.6 career field goal percentage is on pace to set a WVU career record.
- Montgomery's nine double-doubles this season are a career-best.
- Montgomery's 308 career blocks are second all-time at WVU and fourth all-time in the Big 12 Conference.

SINGLE-SEASON NOTABLES

- Tynice Martin (457) is 15 points away from passing Maria Tchobanova (471) for seventh on the WVU sophomore points list.
- Martin's 54 3-pointers are sixth for a Mountaineer sophomore.
- Lanay Montgomery's 77 blocked shots are second all-time by a West Virginia senior.
- If the season concluded today, Montgomery's 68.4 field goal percentage would break her own WVU single-season record (58.9%).
- Chania Ray's 152 assists are fifth all-time by a Mountaineer junior. She needs 11 more to pass Dionne Morris (162) for fourth.

NATION'S BEST

- West Virginia sits in the top 30 nationally in five statistical categories.
- WVU is 10th in blocked shots per game (6.0 bpg), 22nd in scoring margin (+14.3), 25th in scoring offense (75.8), 25th in field goal percentage (45.1%) and 27th in 3-point field goal percentage (36.2%).
- Chania Ray is 24th nationally and leads the Big 12 with 5.8 assists per game.
- Tynice Martin is second in the Big 12 and 66th nationally with 17.6 points per game.
- Lanay Montgomery's 3.0 blocked shots per game are first in the league and 10th nationally.
- Montgomery paces the Big 12 with a 68.4 field goal percentage (128-of-187).
- Sophomore guard Alexis Brewer leads the Big 12 with a 46.0 3-point field goal percentage (29-of-63).

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MANIA

- The Mountaineers have surpassed their double-double total of nine from last season with 18 in 2016-17.
- This year, five different players have recorded double-doubles including a career-best nine from senior center Lanay Montgomery.
- Montgomery and Teana Muldrow have combined for 15 double-doubles this season, including back-to-back double-double games vs. High Point and Morehead State.
- Muldrow has recorded double-doubles in back-to-back games against Oklahoma (22p/13r) and Oklahoma State (14p/13r).

CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the athletic communications staff.

MARTIN GRABS BIG 12 HONORS

- Tynice Martin was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on Feb. 13 after averaging 32.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game last week.
- Martin registered a career-high 35 points, 14 made field goals and six three-pointers in WVU's double-overtime loss at Oklahoma on Feb. 7. Her 35 points were second-most by a WVU sophomore and tied for 10th all-time in a single-game.
- The Atlanta native followed up that performance with 30 points, eight rebounds and a career-best seven triples in the win over Oklahoma State (Feb. 11).
- Martin became the first Mountaineer since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 30 or more points in back-to-back games.

RAY GRASPING THE POINT

- Junior guard Chania Ray has excelled at the point guard position this season. She leads the Big 12 Conference and ranks 24th nationally with 5.8 assists per game.
- Ray has distributed multiple assists in 28 consecutive games since March 2016.
- She has eclipsed the double-digit assists plateau three times this season with 11 vs. Charleston Southern (Nov. 12), 10 against Oklahoma (Jan. 8) and 10 vs. Kansas State (Feb. 15).
- Ray inked her first double-double with 14 points and 10 assists in the win over No. 24 Kansas State (Feb. 15).
- She was named the Big 12 Conference Co-Player of the Week on Jan. 2, along with Oklahoma's Peyton Little.

ALMOST HEAVEN, WEST VIRGINIA

LANAY NO. 2 IN CAREER BLOCKS

- With her five blocks against Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21, Lanay Montgomery moved past Asya Bussie (270) for No. 2 on WVU's all-time career blocks list.
- Montgomery's 308 blocks are fourth all-time in the Big 12. She is fourth in the NCAA among active career leaders.
- She has 870 total rebounds, which ranks fifth all-time at WVU. She needs 21 more to pass Mary Hennen (890) for fourth.
- Additionally, Montgomery has corralled 303 career offensive rebounds, which is fourth.
- Montgomery's nine double-doubles this season are a career-best.
- Her 18 career double-doubles are tied for seventh all-time with Liz Repella.
- With one more double-double, Montgomery can become the first Mountaineer since Maria Tchobanova in 1999 to record 19 or more double-doubles in a career.
- If the trend continues, Montgomery can become the Mountaineers' best shooter in program history surpassing Olayinka Sanni (55.7%). Her career field goal percentage of 59.6% currently ranks first at WVU.
- Montgomery's 17/18 performance against Charleston Southern is the best for a Mountaineer since Donna Abbott inked 22 points and grabbed 19 rebounds against Rutgers Feb. 1991.
- Montgomery tallied a career-high 23 points, grabbed 18 rebounds and blocked six shots against Morehead State on Nov. 30.
- She joined Georgeann Wells (1984) as the only Mountaineers to score 20+, rebound 18+ and block 5+ in a game.
- On Dec. 7, Montgomery garnered NCAA Weekly Starting Five honors for her performance against Morehead State.
- Montgomery was named one of 30 women's basketball candidates announced for the 2017 Senior CLASS Award earlier in January.

Martin Nets Career-Best 28 in Return Home

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a 22-2 run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squish the North Carolina A&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak to 28 makes since March 18, 2016.

Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points. Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. North Carolina A&T was the fifth straight Mountaineer opponent to shoot less than 40 percent, connecting on 19-of-59 for 32.2 percent. The Aggies made 6-of-13 from behind the arc for 46.2 percent.

The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.

The second half was much closer as the Aggies became the first WVU opponent to reach 20 points in a quarter this season. Montgomery and Muldrow were limited in the quarter with two fouls each. The Mountaineers held 52-28 at the break. WVU shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the field compared to NC A&T's 23.5 percent (8-of-34).

It was a continuation of the second half for North Carolina A&T, as the Aggies jumped out on a 14-3 run to trim the game to 55-42 with 6:30 remaining. Dana Brown's jumper with 49.5 seconds left in the quarter cut the Mountaineer advantage to 65-52.

A 9-1 fourth quarter start extended the Mountaineer lead back to 21 points with 6:44 remaining. Montgomery and Ray made back-to-back layups followed by a Martin jumper. The exclamation point to the run was a Muldrow slicing layup that drew the and-one opportunity which she connected on to put WVU up 74-53.

Mountaineers Roll Past East Carolina

Teana Muldrow's double-double paced the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 79-47 victory over East Carolina on Wednesday in the Savannah Invitational held at the Savannah Civic Center.

Three extended runs propelled the Mountaineers (5-0) to their fifth victory of the season. WVU used a 10-2 spurt in the first quarter, a 16-2 second quarter run and a 12-1 fourth quarter run to thwart the Pirates. East Carolina fell to 4-2 after being held to a season-low 47 points.

Muldrow, a junior from East Orange, New Jersey, recorded her second career double-double by scoring season-highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Wednesday marked a breakout performance for Kristina King. The junior made 6-of-8 from the field and added four free throws for 16 points. King finished second in rebounds with eight.

Tynice Martin etched her seventh consecutive double-figure scoring game with 16 points. She grabbed six rebounds and collected two steals in 34 minutes. Chania Ray dished out four assists to lead WVU. Lanay Montgomery was limited for a second straight game due to foul trouble, scoring four points and pulling down three boards.

West Virginia made 29-of-60 from the field for 48.3 percent shooting and connected on 5-of-16 from 3-point range for 31.3 percent. ECU was held to 35.8 percent shooting (19-of-53) from the field, becoming the fifth WVU opponent this season to shoot less than 40 percent.

In the rebounds column, WVU outmanned ECU, 41-32, and outscored the Pirates 34-22 inside the paint. For a fourth game this season, West Virginia recorded double-figure steals with 11.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2 run. ECU would use a 7-3 run to trim the Mountaineer advantage to 13-9. Teana Muldrow added back-to-back buckets to put WVU up 21-16 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, West Virginia utilized a 16-2 run and held the Pirates for nearly a five minute stretch. Martin's layup with 1:08 on the clock gave WVU a 39-25 edge to end the half.

East Carolina trimmed the game to 12 points on multiple occasions in the third period. King snapped a three-plus minute scoring drought with five consecutive points. She picked up a steal and used the fast break to score the layup and connect on the and-one. King then hit another layup to extend the Mountaineer lead to 21 points.

WVU used a 12-1 in the fourth quarter capped by a Muldrow three-pointer to push the edge to 30 points.

WVU Edges Auburn for Savannah Invite Title

Lanay Montgomery's layup with 12 seconds remaining gave the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team a 56-52 victory over Auburn to claim the Savannah Invitational Championship on Thursday evening at the Savannah Civic Center.

The Mountaineers (6-0) led by as many as 14 points in the first half before Auburn (5-1) closed the period on a 15-4 run to cut the halftime lead to 31-28. WVU pushed its advantage to 10, 38-28, with a Montgomery layup at 7:06 left in the third. The Tigers held a brief one-point lead for 1:35 in the fourth quarter, but the Mountaineers maintained a slim lead down the stretch.

Auburn's Jessica Jones made a layup with 1:19 left to tie the game at 52-52. With 12 seconds remaining, Teana Muldrow grabbed an offensive rebound and Montgomery converted the layup for the game-winning basket. Tynice Martin closed out the game with two free throws to give West Virginia its best start since the 2010-11 season.

Montgomery finished with 13 points, five rebounds and three blocks in 22 minutes. Martin led the team with 16 points, which nine of those points were from behind the arc. Muldrow matched her career-high with 14 rebounds and finished with eight points and three assists. Kristina King made 3-of-4 from the field and added two free throws to finish with eight points.

Martin, a native of Atlanta, earned Savannah Invitational MVP honors and Muldrow was named to the All-Tournament Team.

West Virginia shot 38.5 percent (20-of-52) from the field and made 37.5 percent (6-of-16) of its three point attempts. Auburn shot 27.6 percent (16-of-58) from the field and 25.0 percent (5-of-20) behind the arc. Auburn became the seventh consecutive WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field. The Mountaineers withstood the Auburn defensive attack, turning the ball over just 22 times. The Tigers came into the game forcing an average of 30-plus turnovers.

Montgomery scored the Mountaineers first three points and WVU eventually pushed out to a 14-3 lead. A King layup made on the fast break drew the and-one to push the WVU advantage to 22-13 at the end of one WVU lead 31-28 at halftime.

West Virginia opened the third quarter on a 10-0 run, but Auburn fired back. And trimmed the game to one on multiple occasions. King's layup gave WVU a 44-43 edge at the end of three.

Auburn took its only lead in the game with Frerking layup with 8:04 left in the contest. WVU answered immediately with a King jumper. The game went back-and-forth, including a Jones layup with 1:19 on the clock to tie the game at 52-52. From there, WVU used its four-point spurt to secure the sixth win of the season.

WVU Women's Hoops Improve to 10-0

The No. 13/14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team shot a season-high 59.7 percent from the field and improved to 10-0 in a 91-33 victory over USC Upstate on Saturday.

West Virginia opened the contest on an 11-2 run and never trailed. The Mountaineers used a 21-0 scoring spurt in the third and fourth quarters to pick up their 31st consecutive win over a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum. WVU's 12th straight win at the Coliseum ranks seventh all-time, while the 10-game win streak is tied for the 10th longest in program history.

Senior center Lanay Montgomery recorded her fourth double-double of the year with 16 points and 10 rebounds. She blocked four shots and made 8-of-9 from the field for an 88.9 shooting percentage. For a second consecutive game, Kristina King matched season-highs with 16 points and nine rebounds in 19 minutes.

Chania Ray finished with nine points and led WVU with seven assists and four steals. Sophomore Katrina Pardee also tallied nine points in the contest.

West Virginia limited its 11th consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as USC Upstate made just 14-of-59 for 23.7 percent. WVU dished out 24 assists and collected 14 steals in the victory.

Pardee scored West Virginia's first seven points as the Mountaineers opened the contest to an 11-2 lead. Montgomery also added eight points and blocked two shots in seven minutes in the opening quarter.

Six of the first eight points were scored by the USC Upstate to start the second quarter. Montgomery, King and Pardee sparked a 10-3 Mountaineer run. West Virginia closed the half with a 42-19 lead and shot a season-best 63.3 percent from the field in the opening half.

Muldrow made four of West Virginia's first six points in the second half, all of which came from the charity stripe. The Mountaineers closed the third quarter on a 14-point run to extend the margin to 45 points.

WVU added seven more consecutive points to stretch the lead to 79-26 with 7:40 remaining. A layup from Vanessa Agrusa snapped the 21-0 run, but WVU added 13 more points in the quarter for its largest margin of victory win of the season. Brittney Delva led the Spartans with 12 points.

WVU Dishes Out 32 Assists in Win over Longwood

The No. 14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team tied a school-record 32 assists in a 107-40 victory over Longwood on Saturday afternoon at the Charleston Civic Center.

A 16-4 run and another 16-0 spurt in the first quarter set the tone for the Mountaineers. West Virginia shot 71.4 percent (25-of-35) in the first half. Although WVU (11-0) cooled down in the second half, the Mountaineers finished the game shooting 56.8 percent (42-of-74) from the field. WVU's 32 assists on 42 field goals matched 32 assists dished out against Indiana State (Nov. 23, 1984) and Duquesne (Nov. 7, 1984). Longwood fell to 1-7 on the season.

Tynice Martin led the Mountaineers with 21 points for her sixth career 20-point performance. Martin dished out a career-high seven assists and matched a season-high six rebounds. Lanay Montgomery made 9-of-9 from the field and finished with 19 points, eight rebounds and three blocks. Junior guard Teana Muldrow also went a perfect 7-of-7 from the field to finishing the day with 17 points, while dishing out five assists and grabbing four rebounds.

Alexis Brewer eclipsed double figures with a career-high 16 points in 28 minutes. Kristina King rounded out WVU's double-digit scoring with 11 points, and sophomore Katrina Pardee led the team with a career-high 10 assists and zero turnovers in 21 minutes. Desiree Rhodes paced the team with nine rebounds.

Saturday's victory gave West Virginia its 11th straight win, tying for the seventh-longest win streak and second-best start to a season in program history. Longwood became the Mountaineers' 12th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field, knocking down just 23.5 percent (12-of-51). West Virginia won the rebound battle, 49-28, and outscored the Lancers, 40-12, in the paint. WVU converted 24 Longwood turnovers into 29 points. WVU's 107-point performance was the most since tallying 109 against Delaware State on Dec. 18, 2013.

West Virginia opened the game with four different Mountaineers making three-pointers to put WVU up 16-4 with 6:31 left in the first quarter. The team capped a 16-0 run in the first quarter and led 31-8, marking the 15th time this season WVU has limited its opponents to under double-figure scoring in a quarter.

WVU Caps Nonconference Play Unbeaten

The No. 13/12 West Virginia University women's basketball team completed the nonconference slate perfect for the third time in program history with a 77-45 win over Mount St. Mary's on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (12-0) sprinted out to a 19-3 run in the first quarter and never relinquished the lead in the team's 32nd straight win against nonconference opponents at the WVU Coliseum. The Mount (2-9) trimmed the WVU lead to 10 points early in the second quarter, but the Mountaineers responded with 11 consecutive points to seal the team's 14th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia joins the 2010-11 squad (14-0) and the 2002-03 team (11-0) in finishing the nonconference schedule undefeated.

Lanay Montgomery paced the Mountaineers with 16 points and 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. Montgomery finished with five blocks on Wednesday pushing her career total to 273 and passing former teammate Aysa Bussie (270) for second on WVU's all-time career blocks list. The senior made her first five shots to extend her consecutive field goals made streak to 14, before it ended in the first half. She finished 7-of-9 from the field for 77.8 percent shooting.

Kristina King, the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year, registered her first double-double at West Virginia with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Tynice Martin added 16 points followed by 14 from junior Teana Muldrow. Chania Ray led the Mountaineers with six assists, while scoring eight points and grabbing six rebounds in 34 minutes.

Offensively, West Virginia ended the evening with a 47.8 shooting percentage from the field (32-of-67) and scored a season-high 56 points inside the paint. The Mountaineers outscored Mount St. Mary's, 51-31. WVU limited the Mount to 28.8 percent (17-of-59) from the field, marking the 13th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent. Also, Mount St. Mary's is the seventh opponent this season to shoot less than 30 percent.

Montgomery made eight of WVU's first 15 points, as the Mountaineers opened the contest on a 19-3 run in the first five minutes. Mount St. Mary's finished the period with an 8-4 run of its own, including four points from Katrina Dickson to cut the WVU lead to 23-11.

Mount St. Mary's Caroline Hummell scored the first bucket in the second quarter. WVU answered with 11 consecutive points. Montgomery tallied six of her 14 first half points and led the team with seven rebounds at the break.

WVU outscored the Mount 22-15 in the third quarter to stretch its lead to 62-32 at the end of the period. The fourth quarter was much closer as the Mountaineers edged Mount St. Mary's, 15-13. Hummell finished with a team-high 13 points for the Mount.

No. 12 WVU Downs TCU in Big 12 Opener

Strong defensive play and a 32-point third quarter performance propelled the No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to an 83-61 win over TCU on Thursday evening in the Big 12 Conference opener at the Ed and Rae Schollmaier Arena.

WVU (13-0, 1-0) used a series of runs, including a 10-3 spurt in the first quarter to maintain the lead. In the third quarter, West Virginia outscored TCU, 32-20, to stretch its lead to as much as 36. The Horned Frogs (8-4, 0-1) committed 20 turnovers, resulting in 19 Mountaineer points. West Virginia's 17 steals were the most in a Big 12 game for the Mountaineers since joining the league in 2012-13.

Tynice Martin led West Virginia with 21 points, while matching a team high with six steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 19 points and nine rebounds. Guard Chania Ray matched a career-high with 17 points, dished out nine assists, grabbed six boards and collected career-best six steals. Kristina King reached double-digit scoring for a sixth consecutive game with 14 points. Lanay Montgomery led WVU with 11 rebounds, while corralling eight rebounds.

West Virginia's 13-0 start is the second-best in program history. WVU's 13-game win streak is tied for fifth all-time.

Offensively, West Virginia made 26-of-60 from the field for 43.3 percent shooting. WVU connected on 26-of-32 from the field for an 81.3 free throw percentage. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 42-32.

For a 14th straight game, West Virginia held its opponent to less than 40 percent shooting. The Frogs made 37.7 percent (20-of-53) from the field and shot 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from three-point range. TCU entered the game leading the country in three-point field goal percentage. WVU's 10 blocks were the most since deflecting 15 against Morehead State on Nov. 30.

West Virginia sprinted out to a 9-4 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Montgomery scored on a putback with 11 seconds remaining and Muldrow hit a jumper to cap a 10-3 run and give the Mountaineers a 19-7.

TCU was limited to just one three-point make in the first quarter. The Frogs connected on three more, but WVU utilized an 8-0 run midway through the quarter to stretch its lead to as much as 23 points.

The Mountaineers outscored TCU 32-20 in the third quarter despite the Frogs shooting 5-of-9 from three-point range. West Virginia utilized another nine-point spurt and held a 73-39 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Toree Thompson made back-to-back buckets to spark a 12-2 run in the fourth quarter. Amy Okonkwo's three-pointer with 6:23 remaining trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 75-51. However, WVU added eight more points to seal its 13th straight win. Okonkwo led the Frogs with 17 points and eight rebounds.

Ray's 23 Paces WVU in Loss at K-State

The No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team could not overcome Kansas State's strong offensive play, as the Mountaineers fell 86-71 to the Wildcats on Sunday at Bramlage Coliseum.

Kansas State (11-3, 1-1) dominated inside during the first half, scoring 34 of its 51 first half points inside the paint to hold a 51-39 advantage at halftime. The Mountaineers (13-1, 1-1) trimmed the contest to six points with eight minutes left in the third quarter, but K-State proceeded on an 11-2 run to push the lead back to 15 points. WVU trimmed the deficit to 14 late in the fourth quarter, but Kansas State held on to snap the Mountaineers' 13-game winning streak.

Chania Ray scored a career-high 23 points, which included a personal-best six three-point makes. The junior from Alexandria, Virginia, dished out seven assists, grabbed four rebounds and collected two steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 15 points, including 5-of-7 from beyond the arc. WVU's other double-figure scorers included Tynice Martin (14) and Kristina King (11). Lanay Montgomery paced WVU with nine rebounds.

WVU's 14 three-point makes were second all-time in a single-game. The Mountaineers shot 42.4 percent (25-of-59) from the field and 48.3 percent (14-of-29) from behind the arc. Kansas State finished shooting 54.7 percent (35-of-64) from the field - snapping WVU's 14-game streak of holding opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. The Wildcats outscored WVU, 54-22, in the paint and won the rebound battle 35-28. Breanna Lewis paced K-State with 23 points.

The Mountaineers held a 9-6 lead midway through the first quarter. K-State outscored WVU 10-6 in final 3:39, which included back-to-back layups from Lewis to end the quarter.

Kansas State opened the second quarter on an 8-3 run and extended its lead to 10 points with 7:25 remaining. Karyla Middlebrook's layup with 38 seconds on the clock pushed the lead to 14. Muldrow answered with a triple to trim the advantage to 11, but Willock made a free throw to push the edge to 51-39 at halftime.

The paint advantage was dominated by Kansas State as WVU was outscored 34-8, as K-State shot 61.1 percent (22-of-36) from the field. Ray led WVU with 15 points.

West Virginia opened the third period on an 8-2 run, which included back-to-back threes from Ray and Martin. However, K-State made back-to-back threes that sparked an 11-2 run to stretch its lead to 15 with 4:57 left in the quarter. With 27 seconds left in the third, K-State stretched its lead to 21 points.

In the fourth quarter, West Virginia trimmed the game to 17 points and Kansas State scoreless for four-plus minutes. Muldrow's three-pointer cut the game to 14 points with three minutes remaining, but K-State held on to collect its second win against WVU.

Muldrow Nets 16 in Baylor Setback

Junior forward Teana Muldrow led the No. 17/16-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team with 16 points, as the Mountaineers fell, 91-56, to No. 2 Baylor on Wednesday at the WVU Coliseum.

The game remained near-even with an 8-7 BU lead for the first four minutes, but a 10-0 Baylor run later in the quarter stretched the Lady Bear advantage. West Virginia (13-2, 1-2) trimmed the contest to 21 points in the third quarter, but Baylor (14-1, 3-0) maintained the lead to collect its 12th consecutive win.

Muldrow made 6-of-11 from the field and paced WVU with 16 points and led the team with seven rebounds. Lanay Montgomery eclipsed double-digits with 11 points, while grabbing four rebounds and blocking four shots. Tynice Martin tallied 11 points for her 17th consecutive double-figures scoring contest. Junior Chania Ray finished with nine points, a game-high eight assists and six rebounds.

Offensively, West Virginia was limited to 31.1 percent shooting (19-of-61) from the field and 38.5 percent (5-of-13) from behind the arc. Baylor shot at a 44.2 percent clip (34-of-77) from the field and 41.7 percent (5-of-12) from three-point range. BU won the rebound battle, 60-30, and outscored WVU, 46-26, inside the paint.

Ray's jumper with 5:49 left in the first quarter trimmed the Baylor lead to 8-7. However, the Lady Bears answered with 10 consecutive points to take an 18-7 lead. WVU finished the period with a 7-2 run of its own, trailing 20-14 at the end of one quarter.

In the second quarter, Baylor jumped out to a 10-1 run before Muldrow's layup ended the drought at the 4:11 mark. The Lady Bears held a 42-27 halftime lead.

BU opened the second half on a 13-3 run. WVU's Muldrow scored nine consecutive points, including two free throws to trim the deficit to 21 points. However, Baylor capped the quarter with an eight-point spurt to hold a 72-43 advantage. WVU held BU to its lowest point total of the game, 19, in the fourth quarter. Kalani Brown led the Lady Bears with 16 points and 11 rebounds.

No. 22 West Virginia Falls at No. 12 Texas

The No. 22-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team couldn't overcome a 12-point fourth quarter run by No. 12 Texas, as the Mountaineers fell, 69-54, on Sunday afternoon in front of 4,123 fans at the Frank Erwin Center.

There were four lead changes and West Virginia (16-6, 4-6) led by as many as four in the first quarter. WVU had trimmed the deficit to three, 48-45, at the end of the third quarter. However, UT (16-4, 10-0) used a 12-point spur to push its lead to 15 points. The victory gave Texas its 14th consecutive victory and 10th in Big 12 play.

Lanay Montgomery led the team with 11 points and five rebounds after making 4-of-5 from the field. Teana Muldrow also reached double-figures with 10 points in just 12 minutes because of foul trouble. Kristina King paced the team with seven points.

WVU shot 39.1 percent (18-of-46) from the field compared to Texas' 47.3 percent (26-of-55). The Longhorns won the rebound battle, 35-28, and outscored WVU inside the paint, 28-22. The Mountaineers dished out nine assists and collected seven steals, but UT converted 23 WVU turnovers into 22 points.

Foul trouble hampered the Mountaineers in the opening half as Chania Ray, Montgomery and Muldrow were all limited most of the half due to two fouls each.

Muldrow scored six of West Virginia's first eight points, as the Mountaineers opened the first five minutes with an 8-4 advantage. Texas used its size inside to utilize a 10-2 run and took a 14-10 lead. Alexis Brewer's trey as time expired at the end of the quarter snapped a three-minute drought and made it at the 14-13 contest.

WVU used a Brewer layup and a Pardee trey to take an 18-14 lead at the 8:23 mark. UT's Kelsey Lang scored a layup and made the and-one to push the Longhorn lead to six with two minutes left in the opening half. Desiree Rhodes' layup trimmed the West Virginia deficit to 30-26 at the break.

Muldrow's basket early in the third cut the contest to within two. However a 6-0 Longhorn run pushed UT to a nine-point lead. The Mountaineers fought back with a 6-0 run and eventually closed the gap to 48-45 at the end of three.

Brooke McCarty's back-to-back three-pointers and two buckets from Joyner Holmes sparked a 12-0 fourth quarter run to give Texas a comfortable 15-point lead. McCarty finished with a team-leading 15 points for the Longhorns.

No. 22/23 West Virginia Falls to Iowa State

The No. 22/23 West Virginia University women's basketball team suffered an 80-55 loss to Iowa State on Saturday afternoon at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (16-7, 4-7 Big 12 Conference) suffered their first loss to the Cyclones (13-10, 4-8) in the last four games and fell to 7-3 all-time in the series. After the two teams traded the lead four times in the opening two minutes, ISU took a 7-5 lead and never looked back.

Sophomore guard Katrina Pardee led the Mountaineers with 16 points, including a career-high-tying 12 from three-point range, and added five rebounds. Sophomore guard Tynice Martin also reached double figures, with 13 points, all in the second half, and a team-high five assists. On the glass, senior center Lanay Montgomery and junior forward Teana Muldrow each had nine rebounds.

The Mountaineers shot 29.7 percent (19-64) and 24.1 percent from three-point range (7-29). WVU's bench outscored Iowa State's, 9-7.

The Mountaineers trailed early, as the Cyclones opened the game shooting 6-8 from the field to take a 14-8 lead. After a timeout on the floor, ISU extended the advantage to 16-8 before West Virginia chipped away at the deficit. A Muldrow jumper and a Brewer three made it a 16-13 game before Iowa State scored the final points of the quarter to take an 18-13 lead after 10 minutes of play.

The WVU defense held Iowa State to 2-8 from the field and 0-3 from beyond the arc in the final 4:22 of the first quarter.

Pardee opened the second quarter with a three, her third of the game, to cut the Iowa State lead to just two at 18-16. The Cyclones responded with a 12-3 run, holding the Mountaineers scoreless for nearly three minutes. A jumper by junior guard Chania Ray halted the scoring drought, and Brewer followed with a three to make it 32-24. Ray then converted on a four-point play, where she was fouled while making a three and made the ensuing free throw.

With 1:27 left, the Cyclone lead had been cut to 32-28. The visitors responded with a 5-0 run to end the half, taking a 37-28 lead into the locker room.

West Virginia was 10-33 from the field and 6-16 from 3-point range in the first half, while Iowa State was 16-31 and 5-15 from beyond the arc. ISU held a 14-6 advantage in points in the paint and a 9-2 edge in second-chance points. The Cyclones had 23 rebounds to the Mountaineers' 16.

Muldrow opened the scoring in the third quarter with a jumper, but the Cyclones answered with a three to make it a 40-30 game. Iowa State extended its advantage to 13, its largest of the game, at 46-33.

Out of a WVU timeout, Martin hit a jumper, but ISU answered right back with a three. The Iowa State lead reached 17 at 54-37, the largest lead of the game, before a Martin jumper made it 54-39. Iowa State closed the quarter on a 6-2 run to take a 60-41 lead into the fourth quarter.

A pair of free throws in the opening minute of the final quarter extended Iowa State's lead to 21, at 62-41. Martin quickly answered with a jumper to cut the deficit to 19 points, but that was as close as the Mountaineers could get. Iowa State outscored West Virginia 20-14 in the final 10 minutes to seal the victory.

Mountaineers Fall to No. 19 Sooners in Double OT

The West Virginia University women's basketball team was unable to hold a 15-point lead and eventually fell, 90-87, in a double overtime loss to No. 19 Oklahoma on Tuesday, at the Lloyd Noble Center.

The Mountaineers (16-8, 4-8) opened the game with a 9-0 run and held a 15-point lead midway through the third quarter. However, Oklahoma (19-6, 10-3) used a 23-11 fourth quarter period to take force of the game to overtime. Both teams traded 11 points in the first overtime, but eventually OU scored four consecutive points late in the second OT to take the victory. Overall, there were 11 ties and 15 lead changes in the contest.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led the Mountaineers with a career-high 35 points, just one shy of tying the sophomore program record of 36 scored by Meg Bulger. Teana Muldrow contributed with her fifth double-double of the season with 22 points and 13 rebounds. Lanay Montgomery finished with 10 points and nine rebounds. Chania Ray and Muldrow each dished out five assists in the setback.

Offensively, WVU shot just 36.6 percent (26-of-71) from the field compared to Oklahoma's 44.8 percent (30-of-67). Both teams corralled 44 rebounds each. WVU's 21 turnovers resulted in 29 Oklahoma points, while 17 WVU miscues resulted in 17 points for the Mountaineers. West Virginia knocked down 11 three-pointers in the loss.

West Virginia sprinted out to a nine-point lead in the first three and a half minutes, which included six points from Martin and buckets from Katrina Pardee and Montgomery. The Sooners were held scoreless for the first six minutes, but fought back to trim the game to 11-8. However, WVU used an 8-3 run to close the period and take a 19-11 advantage at the end of the period.

Montgomery's putback and Pardee's two free throws stretched the Mountaineer lead to 12, 25-13, with 5:25 remaining. The Sooners cut the game to eight on a couple of occasions and trimmed the contest to 33-25 at halftime after a Gioya Carter jumper.

Martin opened the third quarter with back-to-back three-pointers to push the WVU advantage to 39-25. Vionise Pierre-Louis' two consecutive layups sparked a 6-2 Sooner run to trim the game to 10. WVU responded with a Ray three-pointer, while Martin made a jumper and converted the and-one to push the Mountaineer lead to 15 points. West Virginia held a 12-point lead, 56-44, at the end of three.

Oklahoma used a 14-2 run in the fourth quarter and trim the West Virginia lead to 60-53 with 6:39 remaining. The Mountaineers made only one field goal in the fourth quarter and were outscored 23-11 as the game was tied 67-67 at the end of regulation.

Both teams swapped buckets in the overtime period as the Mountaineers and Sooners swapped leads and finished tied at 78-78 at the end of the first OT.

A Wyatt three-pointer and five Sooner free throw makes in the last minute sealed the Oklahoma win. Pierre-Louis led Oklahoma with 33 points and 13 rebounds.
