## QUICK HITTERS

- No. 22/23 WVU (16-6, 4-6) and Iowa State (12-10, 3-8) meet for the first time this season.
- WVU owns a 7-2 advantage in the all-time series and a 3-1 edge in Morgantown. However, all four of the previous matchups at the WVU Coliseum have been decided by 11 points or less. WVU swept the regular-season series last year, winning 57-47 in Morgantown (Feb. 10) and 82-57 in Ames (March 1).
- All-America candidate Lanay Montgomery continues to lead the nation with her 69.7 field goal percentage (115-of-165). Montgomery is sixth in the NCAA with 3.4 blocks per game. She is averaging 12.3 points and grabbing 9.5 rebounds per game.
- Tynice Martin, also an All-America candidate, leads the Mountaineers with 17.0 points.
- Teana Muldrow is second on the team with 14.5 points and 7.8 rebounds per game.
- WVU dropped a 69-54 decision at No. 12 Texas on Sunday. WVU trailed 48-45 at the end of three quarters, before the Longhorns utilized a 12-0 fourth quarter run to seal the win.

## SCOUTING IOWA STATE

- Iowa State (12-10, 3-8) has lost two of its last three, including an 83-52 setback to No. 2 Baylor on Wednesday.
- The Cyclones are averaging 74.6 points and surrendering 69.5 points per game to opponents. ISU is shooting 40.9 percent from the field compared to its opponents' 42.3 percent. Iowa State is No. 2 nationally with an 80.8 free throw percentage.
- Senior Seanna Johnson, a preseason All-Big 12 selection, leads the Cyclones with 15.6 points and 8.2 rebounds per game.
- Bridget Carleton follows with 15.4 points per game and is the NCAA leader with a 93.7 (74-of-79) free throw percentage.
- Jadda Buckley is also averaging double-digits with 14.4 points per game, while leading the Cyclones with 111 assists.
- All previous four matchups between ISU and WVU in Morgantown have been decided by 11 points or less each game.

## LAST TIME OUT

- No. 22 West Virginia battled in a close game for three quarters at No. 12 Texas last Sunday, until the Longhorns used as 12-0 fourth quarter run to break open the game and win, 69-54, in Austin.
- Lanay Montgomery led the Mountaineers with 11 points, while Teana Muldrow followed with 10 points in the setback.
- Kristina King paced West Virginia with a team-leading seven rebounds.
- WVU committed 23 turnovers resulting in 22 Longhorn points, but trailed by only three points at the end of three quarters.

## MONTGOMERY MAGIC

- Senior center Lanay Montgomery leads the nation with a 69.7 field goal percentage through 22 games this season.
- Montgomery has shot 41 percent or better in 19 of 22 games this season.
- WVU is 10-1 this season when Montgomery makes six or more field goals in a contest.
- Montgomery's 59.6 career field goal percentage is on pace to set a WVU career record.
- Montgomery's eight double-doubles this season are a career-best.
- Montgomery's 305 career blocks are second all-time at WVU and fourth all-time in the Big 12 Conference.

## FEBRUARY FACTS

- West Virginia is 66-47 (.584) in the month of February under Mike Carey.
- Under Carey, when West Virginia wins five or more games in the month of February, the Mountaineers have reached the NCAA Tournament (seven times). Only twice has WVU reached the tournament winning five or fewer games (three in 2011 and four in 2004).
- WVU has won five or more games in February in four of the last five seasons: 6 in 2016, 7 in 2014, 5 in 2013 and 6 in 2012.
- As of Thursday, WVU holds a team RPI of 50 and three top 100 RPI victories.

## SINGLE-SEASON NOTABLES

- Tynice Martin (375) is 35 points away from reaching the top 10 in points scored by a WVU sophomore.
- Martin's 41 3-pointers are 10th all-time by a Mountaineer sophomore.
- Lanay Montgomery's 74 blocked shots are second all-time by a West Virginia senior.
- If the season concluded today, Montgomery's 69.7 field goal percentage would set a WVU single-season record and it would be the ninth-best single-season field goal percentage in NCAA history.
- Chania Ray's 128 assists are seventh all-time by a Mountaineer junior. She needs five more to pass Mandy Ronay for sixth.

## WVU'S THREE Ms

- WVU's three Ms (Tynice Martin, Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow) provide the bulk of the Mountaineers' offense with an average of 43.8 points scored per game.

## STEADY IN THE POLLS

- West Virginia remained No. 22 in this week's Associated Press Top 25 Poll and fell one spot to No. 23 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll.
- WVU has appeared in the AP Poll for 16 consecutive weeks dating back to Feb. 29, 2016, which ranks as the third longest in program history.
- WVU was tabbed to finish fourth in the Big 12 coaches preseason poll.
- Other Big 12 teams include: Baylor (2/2), Texas (12/13) and Oklahoma (18/22).

## NATION'S BEST

- West Virginia sits in the top 30 nationally in six statistical categories.
- WVU is fifth in blocked shots per game (6.6 bpg), 14th in scoring margin (16.7), 17th in field goal percentage (46.2%), 21st in field goal percentage defense (35.7%), 22nd in scoring offense (76.5 ppg) and 29th in rebounding margin (+7.5).
- Chania Ray is 22nd nationally and leads the Big 12 with 5.8 assists per game.
- Ray's 81.4 free throw percentage is fifth in the Big 12.
- Tynice Martin is second in the Big 12 and 81st nationally with 17.0 points per game.
- Lanay Montgomery's 3.4 blocked shots per game are first in the league and sixth nationally.
- Montgomery also leads the nation with a 69.7 field goal percentage (115-of-165).
- Sophomore guard Alexis Brewer leads the Big 12 with a 51.2 3-point field goal percentage (22-of-43).

## PHYSICAL FOR 40

- West Virginia has limited 14 opponents this season to less than 40 percent shooting and eight of those less than 30 percent.
- Through 22 games, opponents are shooting just 35.7 percent (474-of-1326), which ranks 21st in field goal percentage defense.
- WVU has converted 376 opponent turnovers (17.1 TOPG) into 403 points (18.3 ppg) this season.
- WVU has reached 10+ blocks in three games this season: 14 vs. Coppin State, 15 vs. Morehead State and 10 at TCU.
- The 11 field goals for Charleston Southern marked the 17th time in program history that WVU has held an opponent to 11 or fewer field goals in a game since 2004.
- USC Upstate's 33 points were the lowest score for a Mountaineer opponent since Georgetown was limited to 32 points on March 4, 2012.
- Texas was held without a 3-pointer on Jan. 14, marking the fourth time in the last three seasons WVU has held an opponent without a 3-point make: Texas (2017), Oklahoma (2016), Hampton (2015) and Oklahoma State (2015).

### CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

### GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

### DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the athletic communications staff.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLE MANIA

- The Mountaineers have surpassed their double-double total of nine from last season with 14 in 2016-17.
- This year, four different players each recorded double-doubles including a career-best eight from senior center Lanay Montgomery.
- Montgomery and Teana Muldrow have combined for 12 double-doubles this season, including back-to-back double-double games vs. High Point and Morehead State.
- Montgomery has double-doubles in back-to-back games against Texas (12p/14r) and Kansas (15p/13r).

## RAY GRASPING THE POINT

- Junior guard Chania Ray has excelled at the point guard position this season. She leads the Big 12 Conference and ranks 22nd nationally with 5.8 assists per game.
- Ray has distributed multiple assists in 24 consecutive games since March 2016.
- She has eclipsed the double-digit assists plateau twice this season with 11 vs. Charleston Southern (Nov. 12) and 10 against Oklahoma (Jan. 8).
- She was named the Big 12 Conference Co-Player of the Week on Jan. 2, along with Oklahoma's Peyton Little.

## ALMOST HEAVEN, WEST VIRGINIA

- In the last two years, West Virginia is 9-0 against Big 12 teams at home, excluding Baylor and Texas. WVU's last loss other than BU or UT came to Oklahoma State, 52-46, on Feb. 18, 2015.
- With an 83-73 victory over No. 20 Oklahoma on Jan. 8, WVU has reached 10+ home wins in 12 of 16 seasons under Mike Carey.
- West Virginia's 14-game home win streak was snapped with a loss to Baylor on Jan. 4. The streak was the sixth-longest in program history.
- WVU has won a school-record 32 consecutive nonconference games inside the Coliseum dating back to Nov. 24, 2013.
- The Mountaineers' last loss against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum came to Ohio State on Nov. 8, 2013, with WVU falling 70-61.
- The previous record of 19 lasted from Dec. 30, 2008 to Jan. 2, 2011.
- West Virginia is 105-7 (.938) at home against nonconference opponents since 2002.
- WVU is 193-48 (.801) all-time at home under Mike Carey, including 17-0 in 2010.
- With a 9-0 mark, WVU recorded its 10th undefeated season at home against nonconference competition in 16 years under Mike Carey.
- WVU has won 80 percent or more of its home games in seven of the last eight years.
- WVU is 387-156 (.713) at the Coliseum all-time.

- With her five blocks against Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21, Lanay Montgomery moved past Asya Bussie (270) for No. 2 on WVU's all-time career blocks list.
- Montgomery's 305 blocks are fourth all-time in the Big 12. She is fourth in the NCAA among active career leaders.
- She has 834 total rebounds, which ranks seventh all-time at WVU.
- Additionally, Montgomery has corralled 287 career offensive rebounds, which is fourth.
- Montgomery's eight double-doubles this season are a career-best.
- Her 17 career double-doubles are tied for eighth all-time with Dionne Morris, Jean Mewshaw and Yolanda Paige.
- If the trend continues, Montgomery can become the Mountaineers' best shooter in program history surpassing Olayinka Sanni (55.7%). Her career field goal percentage of 59.6% currently ranks first at WVU.
- Montgomery's 17/18 performance against Charleston Southern is the best for a Mountaineer since Donna Abbott inked 22 points and grabbed 19 rebounds against Rutgers Feb. 1991.
- Montgomery tallied a career-high 23 points, grabbed 18 rebounds and blocked six shots against Morehead State on Nov. 30.
- She joined Georgeann Wells (1984) as the only Mountaineers to score 20+, rebound 18+ and block 5+ in a game.
- On Dec. 7, Montgomery garnered NCAA Weekly Starting Five honors for her performance against Morehead State.
- Montgomery was named one of 30 women's basketball candidates announced for the 2017 Senior CLASS Award earlier in January.
- Montgomery is also a nominee for the Allstate Good Works Team.

Martin Nets Career-Best 28 in Return Home

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a 22-2 run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squash the North Carolina A&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak to 28 makes since March 18, 2016.

Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points. Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. North Carolina A&T was the fifth straight Mountaineer opponent to shoot less than 40 percent, connecting on 19-of-59 for 32.2 percent. The Aggies made 6-of-13 from behind the arc for 46.2 percent.

The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.

The second half was much closer as the Aggies became the first WVU opponent to reach 20 points in a quarter this season. Montgomery and Muldrow were limited in the quarter with two fouls each. The Mountaineers led 52-28 at the break. WVU shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the field compared to NC A&T's 23.5 percent (8-of-34).

It was a continuation of the second half for North Carolina A&T, as the Aggies jumped out on a 14-3 run to trim the game to 55-42 with 6:30 remaining. Dana Brown's jumper with 49.5 seconds left in the quarter cut the Mountaineer advantage to 65-52.

A 9-1 fourth quarter start extended the Mountaineer lead back to 21 points with 6:44 remaining. Montgomery and Ray made back-to-back layups followed by a Martin jumper. The exclamation point to the run was a Muldrow slicing layup that drew the and-one opportunity which she connected on to put WVU up 74-53.

Mountaineers Roll Past East Carolina

Teana Muldrow's double-double paced the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 79-47 victory over East Carolina on Wednesday in the Savannah Invitational held at the Savannah Civic Center.

Three extended runs propelled the Mountaineers (5-0) to their fifth victory of the season. WVU used a 10-2 spurt in the first quarter, a 16-2 second quarter run and a 12-1 fourth quarter run to thwart the Pirates. East Carolina fell to 4-2 after being held to a season-low 47 points.

Muldrow, a junior from East Orange, New Jersey, recorded her second career double-double by scoring season-highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Wednesday marked a breakout performance for Kristina King. The junior made 6-of-8 from the field and added four free throws for 16 points. King finished second in rebounds with eight.

Tynice Martin etched her seventh consecutive double-figure scoring game with 16 points. She grabbed six rebounds and collected two steals in 34 minutes. Chania Ray dished out four assists to lead WVU. Lanay Montgomery was limited for a second straight game due to foul trouble, scoring four points and pulling down three boards.

West Virginia made 29-of-60 from the field for 48.3 percent shooting and connected on 5-of-16 from 3-point range for 31.3 percent. ECU was held to 35.8 percent shooting (19-of-53) from the field, becoming the fifth WVU opponent this season to shoot less than 40 percent.

In the rebounds column, WVU outmanned ECU, 41-32, and outscored the Pirates 34-22 inside the paint. For a fourth game this season, West Virginia recorded double-figure steals with 11.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2 run. ECU would use a 7-3 run to trim the Mountaineer advantage to 13-9. Teana Muldrow added back-to-back buckets to put WVU up 21-16 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, West Virginia utilized a 16-2 run and held the Pirates for nearly a five minute stretch. Martin's layup with 1:08 on the clock gave WVU a 39-25 edge to end the half.

East Carolina trimmed the game to 12 points on multiple occasions in the third period. King snapped a three-plus minute scoring drought with five consecutive points. She picked up a steal and used the fast break to score the layup and connect on the and-one. King then hit another layup to extend the Mountaineer lead to 21 points.

WVU used a 12-1 in the fourth quarter capped by a Muldrow three-pointer to push the edge to 30 points.

No. 12 WVU Downs TCU in Big 12 Opener

Strong defensive play and a 32-point third quarter performance propelled the No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to an 83-61 win over TCU on Thursday evening in the Big 12 Conference opener at the Ed and Rae Schollmaier Arena.

WVU (13-0, 1-0) used a series of runs, including a 10-3 spurt in the first quarter to maintain the lead. In the third quarter, West Virginia outscored TCU, 32-20, to stretch its lead to as much as 36. The Horned Frogs (8-4, 0-1) committed 20 turnovers, resulting in 19 Mountaineer points. West Virginia's 17 steals were the most in a Big 12 game for the Mountaineers since joining the league in 2012-13.

Tynice Martin led West Virginia with 21 points, while matching a team high with six steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 19 points and nine rebounds. Guard Chania Ray matched a career-high with 17 points, dished out nine assists, grabbed six boards and collected career-best six steals. Kristina King reached double-digit scoring for a sixth consecutive game with 14 points. Lanay Montgomery led WVU with 11 rebounds, while corralling eight rebounds.

West Virginia's 13-0 start is the second-best in program history. WVU's 13-game win streak is tied for fifth all-time.

Offensively, West Virginia made 26-of-60 from the field for 43.3 percent shooting. WVU connected on 26-of-32 from the field for an 81.3 free throw percentage. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 42-32.

For a 14th straight game, West Virginia held its opponent to less than 40 percent shooting. The Frogs made 37.7 percent (20-of-53) from the field and shot 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from three-point range. TCU entered the game leading the country in three-point field goal percentage. WVU's 10 blocks were the most since deflecting 15 against Morehead State on Nov. 30.

West Virginia sprinted out to a 9-4 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Montgomery scored on a putback with 11 seconds remaining and Muldrow hit a jumper to cap a 10-3 run and give the Mountaineers a 19-7.

TCU was limited to just one three-point make in the first quarter. The Frogs connected on three more, but WVU utilized an 8-0 run midway through the quarter to stretch its lead to as much as 23 points.

The Mountaineers outscored TCU 32-20 in the third quarter despite the Frogs shooting 5-of-9 from three-point range. West Virginia utilized another nine-point spurt and held a 73-39 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Toree Thompson made back-to-back buckets to spark a 12-2 run in the fourth quarter. Amy Okonkwo's three-pointer with 6:23 remaining trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 75-51. However, WVU added eight more points to seal its 13th straight win. Okonkwo led the Frogs with 17 points and eight rebounds.

Ray's 23 Paces WVU in Loss at K-State

The No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team could not overcome Kansas State's strong offensive play, as the Mountaineers fell 86-71 to the Wildcats on Sunday at Bramlage Coliseum.

Kansas State (11-3, 1-1) dominated inside during the first half, scoring 34 of its 51 first half points inside the paint to hold a 51-39 advantage at halftime. The Mountaineers (13-1, 1-1) trimmed the contest to six points with eight minutes left in the third quarter, but K-State proceeded on an 11-2 run to push the lead back to 15 points. WVU trimmed the deficit to 14 late in the fourth quarter, but Kansas State held on to snap the Mountaineers' 13-game winning streak.

Chania Ray scored a career-high 23 points, which included a personal-best six three-point makes. The junior from Alexandria, Virginia, dished out seven assists, grabbed four rebounds and collected two steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 15 points, including 5-of-7 from beyond the arc. WVU's other double-figure scorers included Tynice Martin (14) and Kristina King (11). Lanay Montgomery paced WVU with nine rebounds.

WVU's 14 three-point makes were second all-time in a single-game. The Mountaineers shot 42.4 percent (25-of-59) from the field and 48.3 percent (14-of-29) from behind the arc. Kansas State finished shooting 54.7 percent (35-of-64) from the field - snapping WVU's 14-game streak of holding opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. The Wildcats outscored WVU, 54-22, in the paint and won the rebound battle 35-28. Breanna Lewis paced K-State with 23 points.

The Mountaineers held a 9-6 lead midway through the first quarter. K-State outscored WVU 10-6 in final 3:39, which included back-to-back layups from Lewis to end the quarter.

Kansas State opened the second quarter on an 8-3 run and extended its lead to 10 points with 7:25 remaining. Karyla Middlebrook's layup with 38 seconds on the clock pushed the lead to 14. Muldrow answered with a triple to trim the advantage to 11, but Willock made a free throw to push the edge to 51-39 at halftime.

The paint advantage was dominated by Kansas State as WVU was outscored 34-8, as K-State shot 61.1 percent (22-of-36) from the field. Ray led WVU with 15 points.

West Virginia opened the third period on an 8-2 run, which included back-to-back threes from Ray and Martin. However, K-State made back-to-back threes that sparked an 11-2 run to stretch its lead to 15 with 4:57 left in the quarter. With 27 seconds left in the third, K-State stretched its lead to 21 points.

In the fourth quarter, West Virginia trimmed the game to 17 points and Kansas State scoreless for four-plus minutes. Muldrow's three-pointer cut the game to 14 points with three minutes remaining, but K-State held on to collect its second win against WVU.

Muldrow Nets 16 in Baylor Setback

Junior forward Teana Muldrow led the No. 17/16-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team with 16 points, as the Mountaineers fell, 91-56, to No. 2/2 Baylor on Wednesday at the WVU Coliseum.

The game remained near-even with an 8-7 BU lead for the first four minutes, but a 10-0 Baylor run later in the quarter stretched the Lady Bear advantage. West Virginia (13-2, 1-2) trimmed the contest to 21 points in the third quarter, but Baylor (14-1, 3-0) maintained the lead to collect its 12th consecutive win.

Muldrow made 6-of-11 from the field and paced WVU with 16 points and led the team with seven rebounds. Lanay Montgomery eclipsed double-digits with 11 points, while grabbing four rebounds and blocking four shots. Tynice Martin tallied 11 points for her 17th consecutive double-figure scoring contest. Junior Chania Ray finished with nine points, a game-high eight assists and six rebounds.

Offensively, West Virginia was limited to 31.1 percent shooting (19-of-61) from the field and 38.5 percent (5-of-13) from behind the arc. Baylor shot at a 44.2 percent clip (34-of-77) from the field and 41.7 percent (5-of-12) from three-point range. BU won the rebound battle, 60-30, and outscored WVU, 46-26, inside the paint.

Ray's jumper with 5:49 left in the first quarter trimmed the Baylor lead to 8-7. However, the Lady Bears answered with 10 consecutive points to take an 18-7 lead. WVU finished the period with a 7-2 run of its own, trailing 20-14 at the end of one quarter.

In the second quarter, Baylor jumped out to a 10-1 run before Muldrow's layup ended the drought at the 4:11 mark. The Lady Bears held a 42-27 halftime lead.

BU opened the second half on a 13-3 run. WVU's Muldrow scored nine consecutive points, including two free throws to trim the deficit to 21 points. No. 24/23 WVU Outlasts Kansas

Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow each recorded a double-double in the No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 62-51 victory over Kansas on Wednesday evening at Allen Fieldhouse.

West Virginia (15-4, 3-4) led by 12 points in the second quarter. However, Kansas (6-12, 0-7) fought back with a 13-3 run to open the third quarter and take a 35-34 lead with 4:06 left in the period. A Tynice Martin trey with 48 seconds remaining in the third, gave WVU the 39-37 go-ahead lead. The Jayhawks trimmed the game to three early in the fourth, but the Mountaineers made 12 free throws in the final 45 seconds to secure the win; giving Kansas its 25th consecutive Big 12 loss.

Montgomery etched her eighth double-double this season with 15 points and 13 rebounds, while blocking six shots. Muldrow inked her fourth double-double this season with 12 points and a career-high 15 rebounds, while dishing out a team-leading six assists. Martin netted a team-high 21 points, including 9-of-12 from the charity stripe.

West Virginia shot 36.8 percent (21-of-57) from the field and held Kansas to 27.6 percent shooting (16-of-58). The Jayhawks were the 14th WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field this season. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 52-32, and outscored the Jayhawks, 28-20, inside the paint. WVU outscored KU, 8-6, in second-chance point opportunities. Kansas forced 25 Mountaineer turnovers, but only converted 13 into points.

Montgomery and Martin combined for West Virginia's first 10 points to open the game in the first five minutes. WVU added 10 more points to finish the period and led 20-10 at the end of one.

Kansas opened the second quarter on a 7-2 run. KU's Jessica Washington hit a three-pointer and made two free throws to trim the deficit to 28-24. Chania Ray drained a trey as time expired in the half, putting the Mountaineers up 31-24. WVU shot 44.8 percent (13-of-29) from the field and held KU to 30.0 percent shooting (9-of-30).

In the third quarter, the Jayhawks started a 13-3 run and took a 35-34 lead with a McKenzie Calvert 3-pointer with four minutes remaining. However, Martin responded with a trey with 39 seconds left to give WVU a 39-37 edge at the end of three.

Muldrow's back-to-back layups stretched the Mountaineer lead to 47-40 with 6:10 remaining in the contest. The Mountaineers connected on 12 free throws down the stretch to secure their third Big 12 win this season. Washington finished with a game-high 24 points for the Jayhawks.

No. 24 WVU Battles, Falls at No. 2 Baylor

No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia battled No. 2/2 Baylor, but fell, 79-73, in a hard-fought contest on Saturday afternoon in front of 6,462 fans at the Ferrell Center.

West Virginia (15-5, 3-5) held brief leads in the first and second quarters and for a total of 3:21 in the game. Baylor (19-1, 8-0) held a 40-34 advantage at the half, marking the closest halftime margin for the Lady Bears in Big 12 play.

Katrina Pardee made a layup and hit a three-pointer to trim the game to four, 65-61, with 5:51 left in the game. However, BU made six free throws in the final minute to collect the win.

BU came into Saturday's game with a +35.1 scoring margin in Big 12 games and had its closest game, a 23-point victory over TCU. WVU's 73 points were the most scored against the Lady Bears this season.

Teana Muldrow led WVU with a game-high 20 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Tynice Martin tallied 18 points, while dishing out four assists. Pardee finished with 13 points, followed by 11 points and five assists from Chania Ray.

Baylor finished shooting 45.2 percent (28-of-62) from the field compared to WVU's 41.7 percent (30-of-72). The Lady Bears won the rebound battle, 42-38, and edged WVU, 44-42, inside the paint. Baylor made 20-of-26 from the charity stripe for 76.9 percent compared to West Virginia's 9-of-13 for 69.2 percent.

Pardee, Muldrow and Ray combined for West Virginia's six-point run to take a 12-6 lead with 6:42 left in the first. However, Baylor proceeded on a 13-1 to push its lead to seven. The Mountaineers fought back and Muldrow's trey capped the period, trimming the contest to 25-24.

Martin's layup at the 8:10 mark gave West Virginia its first lead, 28-27. The two teams traded buckets throughout the game, but BU eventually stretched out to a 40-34 lead at halftime after outscoring the Mountaineers, 15-10, in the quarter.

WVU shot 35.9 percent from the field (14-of-39) compared to Baylor's 43.8 percent (14-of-32) at the half.

Alexis Jones layup pushed Baylor's lead to 11 points at the 5:21 mark in the third. Alexis Brewer followed up with a layup plus connected on the and-one, while Martin added a jumper to trim the contest back to six. BU made six of its next eight to extend its lead to 59-47 with 1:25 left in the third. At the end of three, Baylor maintained a 63-52 advantage.

Pardee's bucket with 6:39 left in the fourth trimmed the game to 65-58. She followed up the next possession with a three to narrow the game to four. However, Baylor responded with back-to-back jumpers to extend the lead to eight.

Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow combined for 43 points, as the No. 22-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team collected an 89-79 win over Texas Tech on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (16-5, 4-5) opened up to a 22-point lead late in the second quarter, before the Lady Raiders (11-8, 3-5) stormed back nailing five three-pointers and outscoring WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter. Texas Tech cut the game to within seven in the final quarter, but West Virginia outscored TTU, 27-24, in the period to collect their 16th victory of the season.

Muldrow matched a season-high with 22 points, grabbed nine rebounds and dished out a career-high seven assists. Montgomery followed with 21 points, nine rebounds and three blocks. Chania Ray reached double-figure scoring with 12 points and six rebounds. Tynice Martin finished with 11 points and five rebounds. Katrina Pardee and Alexis Brewer added nine and eight points, respectively.

Statistically, the Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the field (33-of-62) compared to Texas Tech's 47.6 percent (30-of-63). The Lady Raiders made 13 three-pointers for 54.2 percent shooting, while WVU made 7-of-14 for 50 percent from behind the arc. The Mountaineers connected on 16-of-19 free throws for 84.2 percent. WVU dished out 20 assists, collected eight steals and blocked five shots.

West Virginia came out on fire with a 16-2 run to open the game in the first five minutes. Texas Tech made just 3-of-14 in the quarter, as the Mountaineers maintained a 24-8 lead at the end of the period.

Texas Tech used three-pointers from Larryn Brooks and Recce Caldwell to trim the deficit to 14 points. WVU stretched its lead to 22 with a Montgomery layup at the 1:45 mark, but WVU held a 43-24 advantage at break.

To open the third quarter, the Lady Raiders opened by making seven three-pointers in the first six minutes to trim the deficit to 50-43. TTU would outscore WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter and trim the deficit to five points after a pair of Brooks free throws at the 1:43 mark.

The No. 22-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team couldn't overcome a 12-point fourth quarter run by No. 12 Texas, as the Mountaineers fell, 69-54, on Sunday afternoon in front of 4,123 fans at the Frank Erwin Center.

There were four lead changes and West Virginia (16-6, 4-6) led by as many as four in the first quarter. WVU had trimmed the deficit to three, 48-45, at the end of the third quarter. However, UT (16-4, 10-0) used a 12-point spurt to push its lead to 15 points. The victory gave Texas its 14th consecutive victory and 10th in Big 12 play.

Lanay Montgomery led the team with 11 points and five rebounds after making 4-of-5 from the field. Teana Muldrow also reached double-figures with 10 points in just 12 minutes because of foul trouble. Kristina King paced the team with seven points.

WVU shot 39.1 percent (18-of-46) from the field compared to Texas' 47.3 percent (26-of-55). The Longhorns won the rebound battle, 35-28, and outscored WVU inside the paint, 28-22. The Mountaineers dished out nine assists and collected seven steals, but UT converted 23 WVU turnovers into 22 points.

Foul trouble hampered the Mountaineers in the opening half as Chania Ray, Montgomery and Muldrow were all limited most of the half due to two fouls each. Muldrow scored six of West Virginia's first eight points, as the Mountaineers opened the first five minutes with an 8-4 advantage. Texas used its size inside to utilize a 10-2 run and took a 14-10 lead. Alexis Brewer's trey as time expired at the end of the quarter snapped a three-minute drought and made it at the 14-13 contest.

WVU used a Brewer layup and a Pardoe trey to take an 18-14 lead at the 8:23 mark. UT's Kelsey Lang scored a layup and made the and-one to push the Longhorn lead to six with two minutes left in the opening half. Desiree Rhodes' layup trimmed the West Virginia deficit to 30-26 at the break.

Muldrow's basket early in the third cut the contest to within two. However a 6-0 Longhorn run pushed UT to a nine-point lead. The Mountaineers fought back with a 6-0 run and eventually closed the gap to 48-45 at the end of three.

Brooke McCarty's back-to-back three-pointers and two buckets from Joyner Holmes sparked a 12-0 fourth quarter run to give Texas a comfortable 15-point lead. McCarty finished with a team-leading 15 points for the Longhorns.
