The Kick Off

- The No. 1-ranked West Virginia University women's soccer team opens its 2017 season at No. 5-ranked Georgetown on Friday, Aug. 18, at 4 p.m., at Shaw Field, in Washington, D.C.
- WVU is 9-9-3 in season openers. Friday marks the fifth straight season the Mountaineers have opened the season away from Morgantown, and the team is 1-1-2 in that span.
- Nikki Izzo-Brown enters her 23rd season as a head coach and 22nd at WVU. Her career coaching record stands at 322-108-46 (.725), and she is 309-103-46 (.725) all-time with the Mountaineers.
- WVU ranks No. 1 in the United Soccer Coaches NCAA Division I Women National Preseason Rankings, the squad's first-ever preseason No. 1 ranking. The squad earned its first national No. 1 ranking in 2016 and held the position for eight weeks. WVU was also unanimously picked No. 1 in the Big 12 Conference Preseason Poll for the third time in four years.
- Dating back to WVU's 1-0 (20T) loss to then-No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, 2016, the WVU defense has posted a shutout in 31 of 36 halves played, allowing only seven goals in that span.
- Fifteen letterwinners return from a 2016 season which saw the Mountaineers advance to the NCAA College Cup for the first time in program history and finish as the National Runner-Up. WVU earned a nation- and program-best 23 wins and 18 shutouts and finished the season at 23-2-2, 8-0 Big 12. The five-time reigning Big 12 regular-season champions, WVU swept the conference titles for the third time in four years.
- Senior forward All-American Michaela Abam has paced the Mountaineers in goals each of her three seasons at WVU. A 2017 MAC Hermann Trophy candidate, she ranks No. 8 all-time with 32 career goals and No. 9 with 77 career points.

West Virginia vs. Georgetown

- WVU is 14-4-2 all-time against the Hoyas. The two teams met annually as members of the Big East Conference.
- In their last meeting, the squads played 101 minutes of scoreless action before Hoya senior Grace Damaska tallied the lone goal on a long, lofting ball that hit off the crossbar before falling into the net. Ranked No. 1 at the time, WVU's loss to No. 9 GU snapped its 30-match unbeaten home streak.
- WVU finished with a 23-8 edge in shots and forced Arielle Schechtman into eight saves. Rylee Foster stopped three for the Mountaineers, who also tallied a 9-5 advantage in corner kicks.

The Last Time at Georgetown

- Kate Schwindel scored the then-fastest goal in school history (0:55), and Bry McCarthy, the Mountaineers' current graduate assistant, added two assists in leading No. 21 WVU to a 3-1 victory over GU on Sept. 30, 2011, at North Kehoe Field.
- Emily Dillon and Black Miller added scores for WVU, and Sara Keane made seven saves in the win.

A Look at the Hoyas

- GU won its first Big East Conference Championship in 2016 and shut out four straight opponents in the NCAA Tournament en route to its first-ever NCAA College Cup appearance, where the squad fell 1-0 to eventual champion USC. GU finished the year 20-3-3 and 6-1-2 in Big East play.
- Two-time All-American Rachel Corboz led GU in 2016 with 38 points on 11 goals and a nation-best 16 assists. The midfielder is listed alongside Michaela Abam on the 2017 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List.

Mountaineers Hit No. 1 in 2016

The Mountaineers earned the No. 1 ranking in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) NCAA Division I Poll on Oct. 11, 2016. It was the team's first-ever No. 1 ranking in the national poll.

The Mountaineers were the first Big 12 Conference program to earn the No. 1 ranking in the NSCAA Poll.

WVU sat atop the three major polls for the first time in program history on Oct. 11, 2016. On Oct. 18, the Mountaineers ranked No. 1 in all three major polls, as well as the NCAA RPI, for the first time in program history.

Picked to Win Again

The Mountaineers were unanimously picked No. 1 by the league coaches in the 2017 Big 12 Conference Soccer Preseason Poll. It marks the third time in four seasons WVU was the unanimous No. 1 pick and the fifth straight year the Big 12 coaches tabbed the Mountaineers as No. 1; the team was not chosen in 2012, its first season in the league. WVU is the only team in conference history to earn multiple unanimous selections.

The Best of the Big 12

A conference-record six Mountaineers were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Soccer Team: unanimous selection Michaela Abam, repeat honoree Carla Portillo, Amandine Pierre-Louis, Sh'Nia Gordon, Bianca St. Georges and Rylee Foster.

Home Points

Big 12 or Big East, one fact has remained constant for the Mountaineers since 2009 - they do not lose home conference matches. WVU shows a 34-match unbeaten streak in conference games at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium and has not dropped a league contest since losing 3-2 in overtime to No. 8 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2009. The streak ranks third nationally. WVU is 19-0-1 all-time in home Big 12 matches.

We Are the Champions! (x5)

With its 3-0 win at TCU on Oct. 21, 2016, the Mountaineers earned the Big 12 Conference regular-season title, their fifth straight crown. WVU has won the title each season since joining the Big 12 in 2012, and the team is the first program in Big 12 history to win five straight outright championships. Also the 2016 Big 12 preseason favorite, WVU's accomplishment marked the 10th time in Big 12 history the preseason favorite in the coaches poll also won the title. WVU owns a 35-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play and is unbeaten at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

The Mountaineers swept the conference's titles three weeks later, as WVU claimed its third Big 12 Soccer Championship crown in four seasons with a come-from-behind, 3-2 overtime win against TCU on Nov. 6, 2016, at Swope Soccer Village, in Kansas City, Missouri. The program has claimed six conference championship titles since winning its first in the Big East Conference in 2007.

Dating back to its days in the Big East Conference, WVU has won six straight conference regular-season crowns and 10 since its first title in 2002. WVU has won 11 regular season and championship conference titles in seven seasons and 16 since 2002.

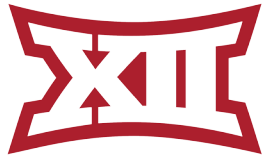

Challenges Await

The Mountaineers will face one of the most difficult schedules in the program's 22-year history this fall, as nine of the team's opponents qualified for the 2016 NCAA Tournament. Included in the schedule are matches against top-25 opponents in three of the first four weeks, as well as an annual match against Penn State, the 2015 National Champion.

Eleven matches are scheduled for Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium, including five Big 12 Conference matches.

Big-Time Offensive Threats Return

Paced by three-time reigning leading team scorer Michaela Abam, the Mountaineer offense returns an incredible 85 percent of the 52 goals scored in 2016.

Abam led WVU last year with a career-best 12 scores. A member of the 2016 NSCAA All-America Second Team and the co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, she finished the season with a team-best and career single-season high 33 points (12 G, 9 A). Her assist total, also a career single-season best, ranked No. 2 on the team. Abam ranked tops in the Big 12 Conference in points, goals and game-winners (5) and No. 2 in assists. She also ranked No. 24 nationally in points and No. 25 in game-winning goals.

Abam ranks No. 8 all-time in program history with 32 career goals and needs 21 to match the school record. She also ranks No. 9 all-time with 77 career points and needs 48 to match the WVU record.

Also returning are senior midfielder Carla Portillo, a 2016 NSCAA All-Central Region Second Team and All-Big 12 First Team honoree, and junior forward Sh'Nia Gordon. The duo ranked No. 3 on the team last season with 17 points each. The mark was a career single-season best for both. Gordon finished second on the team with seven goals, while Portillo chipped in five.

Senior forward Heather Kaleiohi and junior forward Hannah Abraham also return following double-digit point totals in 2016. Kaleiohi finished with 14 points (6 G, 2 A), while Abraham tallied 10 (4 G, 2 A). All four of Abraham's scores were game-winners.

Hermann Hopeful

Senior forward Michaela Abam was named to the 2017 Missouri Athletic Club (MAC) Hermann Trophy Watch List. At least one Mountaineer has been named to the initial watch list in each of the last seven years, including 2016 Hermann Trophy winner Kadeisha Buchanan. WVU has had eight semifinalists, including Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence in 2015 and 2016. Buchanan was the first-ever Mountaineer to claim the award.

Backline Tough to Break

For the second straight season, the WVU defense rewrote the record book, recording a nation-best 18 shutouts in 2016. Included in the total were eight clean sheets in Big 12 Conference regular-season play, and the Mountaineers became the first team in league history to post a shutout season.

Junior Easter Mayi Kith looks to anchor the backline following the graduation of 2016 MAC Hermann Trophy winner Kadeisha Buchanan. Returning alongside Mayi Kith are senior Amandine Pierre-Louis, an All-Big 12 honoree last year, and junior Bianca St. Georges, the 2015 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

Sophomore Rylee Foster, a 2016 NSCAA All-Central Region Second Team honoree, as well as an All-Big 12 Second Team and Freshman Team member, returns in goal. Available for 17 matches last season, she was credited with eight of the team's shutouts and finished with a 0.42 goals-against average (GAA), the best single-season total in program history. Her GAA ranked No. 1 in the conference and No. 7 nationally.

First-Year Mountaineers

Eleven freshmen join the Mountaineers for the 2017 season, including three who have played for their national teams: midfielder Issy Coombes (New Zealand) and defenders Lois Joel (England) and Grace Smith (England).

Also donning the Gold and Blue for the first time this season are forwards Stefany Ferrer and Lauren Segalla, midfielder Malia Kaleiohi, defenders Danielle Gordon, Lexi Mitchell and Chloe Zamiela and goalkeepers Kayla Thompson and Ashley Triplett.

Double the Fun

Since 2010, WVU has had 24 instances where one Mountaineer has netted at least two goals in one game, including seven two-goal performances in 2014, the program's best single-season total in that time frame. The WVU single-game goal record is four, hit by senior forward Michaela Abam in the Mountaineers' record-setting 8-0 win vs. Villanova on Sept. 6, 2015.

Score Often, Score Early

One of coach Nikki Izzo-Brown's weekly goals is for the Mountaineers to score first. Izzo-Brown not only urges the Mountaineers to score first - she also wants them to score fast.

Senior Heather Kaleiohi has scored the two fastest goals in program history. She set the record at Richmond on Sept. 23, 2016, finding the back of the net just 47 seconds into the match. She then scored the team's fastest goal in an NCAA Tournament match when she put a shot behind the Northern Kentucky goalkeeper at the 0:49 mark on Nov. 12, 2016, in Morgantown.

Morgantown Magic

The Mountaineers have developed a true home field advantage, going 119-18-14 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since its opening in August 2004.

WVU shows a 34-match unbeaten streak in conference games in Morgantown and has not dropped a league contest since losing 3-2 in overtime to No. 8 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2009. The streak ranks No. 3 nationally. WVU is 19-0-1 all-time in home Big 12 matches.

The Mountaineers played in front of more than 23,000 fans in 14 home games in 2016 and set seven top-10 attendance marks, including a season-high mark of 2,471 for WVU's 1-0, double-overtime win against Ohio State on Nov. 18 in the second round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament. The crowd was the second largest women's attendance mark in stadium history. WVU finished the year ranked No. 4 nationally in accumulate attendance (23,131) and No. 7 in average attendance (1,652). Both numbers were tops in the Big 12 Conference.

In just 21 seasons, the WVU women's soccer team has earned 309 program wins, an average of 15 victories per season. The Mountaineers earned program win No. 300 with a 3-0 victory at TCU on Oct. 21, 2016. All program wins have come under coach Nikki Izzo-Brown.

Seniors' Last Stand

The 2017 Mountaineer senior class has earned five conference titles during its time at WVU and shows a three-year record of 58-7-7, 21-0-2 in the Big 12.

This year's senior class – Michaela Abam, Heather Kaleiohi, Ali Magaletta, Amandine Pierre-Louis and Carla Portillo – has won three straight Big 12 regular-season crowns, as well as the 2014 and 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship titles.

The program record for conference titles won by one class is seven, set by the 2014 senior class and matched by the 2016 class.

Nice to Meet You

WVU's 2017 regular-season schedule features just one first-time opponent in Kansas State. The Mountaineers will face the Wildcats in Manhattan, Kansas, on Friday, Sept. 29. This is KSU's first season competing in the Big 12 Conference.

In the program's 21-year history, WVU has faced 109 different teams.

Power of Pink

Raising awareness for breast cancer research is a cause close to coach Nikki Izzo-Brown, and each year, she and the Mountaineers raise funds for Morgantown's Betty Puskar Breast Care Center. Most recently, WVU donated a check for \$5,025 at halftime of the WVU-OU match on October 2, 2016.

WVU passed the \$100,000 threshold in 2013. In 12 years, the Mountaineers have raised more than \$120,000 for breast cancer research.
